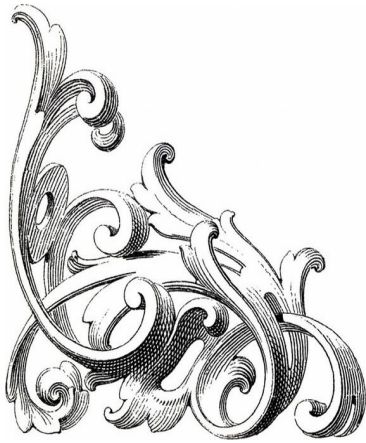
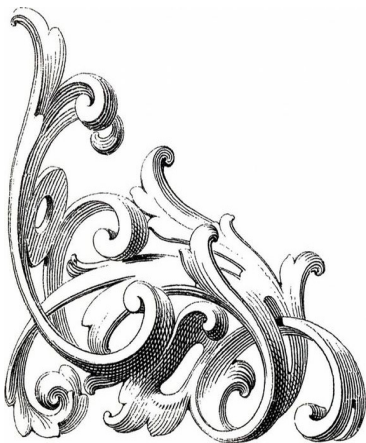

“From the Archives”



Shown above is the damage wrought by an explosion yesterday at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Paul C. Arthur, 103 McAllister street, Hanover. Mrs. Arthur, who was in the kitchen at the time of the blast, is in Hanover General Hospital, suffering from burns of the head, arms and face.

Famous Fires of Hanover

Over the past years, Hanover has been rocked by some disastrous fire dispatches causing extensive damage and destruction. This feature article will transport you back in time to 1957 and 1960 for a look at two of those fire calls.

On April 11, 1957, at 3:20 a.m., multiple phone calls, followed by the sounding of Box 13 at Locust and Walnut Streets, sent Hanover borough firemen to Cramer Florist, to the rear of the 200 block of East Walnut Street. Firemen arrived to find a well-advanced fire involving the boiler room, the coal shed, and a row of storage buildings and garages. Prior to the arrival of firemen, neighbors drove six delivery trucks from the burning garages. The fire had extended to the ends of three 100-foot-long greenhouses.

A general alarm called out all borough fire equipment, while Pennville Fire Company stood by in Hanover. The fire caused an estimated \$30,000 in damage, including 5,000 Easter flowers ready for market. Quick repairs were made to the boiler room to protect the plants in five other greenhouses. The Eagle Fire Company's canteen truck supplied coffee and doughnuts to the firemen.

On August 1, 1960, at 11:40 a.m., the Eagle engine house in Hanover received a telephone call for an explosion on 103 McAllister Street. They radioed the Hanover Fire Company to respond with their apparatus and ambulance where they found the bungalow-type home literally ripped apart by an explosion.

Prior to the arrival of the firemen, neighbor Gerald Marchio of 105 McAllister found 57-year-old Mrs. Mary E. Arthur in the kitchen of the home, burned and cut up, just standing there screaming. He led her from the remains of the home as firemen arrived. Firemen quickly contained the resulting fire and Mrs. Arthur was rushed to the hospital by the Hanover Fire Company ambulance, where she was treated for burns over 15 percent of her body.

Four other homes were damaged by the blast. Investigation revealed that the blade of a road grader that was rebuilding McAllister Street had caught the natural gas service line into the home, breaking a connection in the basement and allowing natural gas to accumulate until it found an ignition source, most likely the water heater.
