

2023 was a very busy year as reported by our GHAFM Secretary, Gary Rickrode. He reports the following accomplishments:

- 1. We had 1096 visitors to the museum from many parts of the USA and the world.
- 2. Seventeen new GHAFM members were added.
- 3. We participated in Give Local York with a very good donation amount.
- 4. The Fire Museum parlor was named the Chris Lockard Parlor in memory of Past President Christopher Lockard.
- 5. We successfully hosted the Susquehanna Valley Region of the Horseless Carriage of America where 75 antique cars and 145 members visited.
- 6. Olivia Blake from PEONY Marketing was hired to assist with the Fire Museum web site and social media platforms.
- 7. Participated in two Fire Service history flea markets.
 - 8. Acquired Chris Lockard's train display.
- 9. Installed HVAC Mini-Split air conditioning on the second floor of the Fire Museum.
- 10. Re-habbed the Fire Museum storage shed with paint, spouting and other structural repairs.
- 11. Added a QR code for the Train Garden, Newsletter and Pay-Pal donation effort.
- 12. Accepted the 1961 International fire truck donation from the Chris Lockard estate.
- 13. Accepted the 1934 Dodge fire truck donation from the Hanover Area Fire and Rescue.
- 14. Completed another Holiday Train Garden with outstanding visitor attendance and Fire Museum volunteers.
- 15. Accepted several hundred new donated items for the Fire Museum.
- 16. Hosted a record number of Junior Fire Cadets visiting the Fire Museum.

"Wayne's World" One Historical Piece at a Time

Fire Museum Donations



This issue of "Wayne's World" includes several donations and a museum highlight.

Curator Wayne Bollinger reports donations accepted at the fire museum this quarter included two marble pieces from the World Trade Center 911 attack in New York city from an anonymous donor. Wayne designed and manufactured a keepsake box for these items. They will be displayed in the Fire Museum.

Other donations included totes of historical memorabilia from the Penn Twp. Emergency Services, various fire memorabilia items from Jean Masenheimer, photos, a plate and sprinkler heads from Larry Sherfey, several photos, challenge coins and a hat badge from Eugene Lockard, drip pans from Dennis Fausey, train track and transformer from Sue Miller.

"What is IT"



Curator Wayne Bollinger is holding a kerosene fueled ignitor for our 1882 Silsby steam pumper displayed in the museum. It is manufactured from brass, has a cotton wick, is 20 inches long and 2" in diameter. The smaller part is the snuff cap for extinguishing the flame on the wick.

It was used by the engineer to light the coal in the steam pumper's fire box. Oil soaked rags were paced in the bottom with kindling and coal on top. The engineer would light the kerosene ignitor and applied the flame to the oily rags that created a fire to burn the coal.

This is a very rare item and the GHAFM is very excited to have it on display. It is a donation to the Fire Museum from Larry Baubilitz.

Fire Truck Repairs and Rehab

Henry Hartman replaced some wiring on the 1934 Dodge after it broke down while being transferred to the Clover Lane Station. Thank you Henry for your professional repair getting her going again.

Brian McDermitt is installing a canvass cab over framework and building a removable hose load for the museum's 1961 International consisting of 2 1/2" and 1 1/2" attack lines. Thank you Brian for adding these items to the International.





The Fire Museum's Dodge and International fire trucks were transferred to Clover Lane Station and Clearview Station during the Holiday Train Garden after all insurance, title work and registration was completed. Several GHAFM members and officers have been working for some time with finalizing the donations of these fire trucks to the Fire Museum. President Lillich announced at the December Membership Meeting "it's official", everything for the donation and vehicle registration is complete. Thank you everyone that worked to bring these trucks permanently to the fire museum.

Curator Wayne Bollinger reports the brakes on the Fire Museum's 1961 International are working fine after Henry and Dale Hartman made several repairs recently.
